All riders and horses competing in FEI-sanctioned competitions **must** be registered with the FEI prior to the competition; otherwise scores earned at the competition will not be recognized by the FEI.

2009 AUTHORIZATION TO COMPETE- SUPPLEMENTAL INFORMATION

Eligibility Rules for Competing in an FEI Ride

Rider: Have you ridden in any FEI races during 2007 and/or 2008?

- If no, then you must go through the Novice qualification process as per Section 816
- If yes, then the rider may ride at the next * level in 2009 above the distance successfully completed. (e.g. 2008 rules – 120km / 75 mi was a 3* event; 2009 rules – 120km / 75 mi is a 2* event. Therefore, a rider is considered to have successfully completed at the 2* level during the 24 months prior to January 1st, 2009, and is deemed qualified to now compete at the 3* level.

Horse: Has the horse ridden in any FEI races during 2007 and/or 2008?

- If no, then you must go through the Novice qualification process as per Section 816
- If yes, then the rider may ride at the next * level in 2009 above the distance successfully completed. See above.

Novice Qualification Process- FEI Section 816

Rider and Horse but not necessarily as a combination, during the 24 months prior, must have successfully complete at the Novice level either

- 2 rides of 40-79 km, and 2 rides of between 80-90 km at speeds of 16 kmh or under, or
- 3 rides of 80-90 km at speeds of 16 kmh or under

Progressing from *(Star) levels

Rider must successfully complete a ride at the particular* level before proceeding to the next level. The Eligibility is for life

Horse must successfully complete one ride at the particular* level before proceeding to the next level. The Eligibility is for 24 months.

Horses Age

Northern hemisphere horses are assumed to have their birthdays on January 1st of the year they are born. The horse must be:

- 6 years old to compete in a 1* event
- 6 years old to compete in a 2* event
- 7 years old to compete in a 3* event
- 8 years old to compete in a 4* event

Horse's Log Sheet – Article 820.8 of the FEI Rules for Endurance:

“Each horse shall have an FEI Endurance Log to be kept with its passport or identification document. This shall contain veterinary information in addition to date, location, distance and * category of each Endurance event. The horse's result: completion, completed distance to the nearest vet gate, grounds for non classification (metabolic, lameness or both), treatments at the venue, referral for hospitalization, mandatory rest periods and any other comments necessary to protect the horse's future competition safety and welfare deemed necessary by the veterinary commission. Only the Veterinary Delegate, President of the Ground Jury and Appeal Committee can make entries in the log book.”

Mandatory Rest for Horses – Article 815.3 of the FEI Rules for Endurance:

- 815.3.1 After competing in a CEI event, a horse must be given a mandatory minimum rest period, as defined, before it is again eligible to participate in an FEI competition:
Distance completed: 0 - 80km = 13 days rest
81km and above = 20 days rest
- 815.3.2 If a horse is eliminated for metabolic reasons which require immediate invasive treatment at any CEI event, it must be given a mandatory minimum rest of 60 days before it is again eligible to participate in a CEI event.
- 815.3.3 If a horse is eliminated for metabolic reasons which require immediate invasive treatment at any 2 consecutive CEI events or twice within any 3 month period, it must be given a mandatory rest period of 90 days before it is again eligible to participate in a CEI event.
